#### 'Ashura' Puppet Opera Heading to Isfahan

Noted Iranian theater director Behrouz Gharibpour will stage

Announcing this, the director told Fars News Agency that following well-received performances in Tehran, 'Aran' troupe will be heading to Isfahan province in mid January.

#### Goya Prints on View in Valladolid

The Municipal Exhibition Hall of the Museum of Passion in The Municipal Exhibition Hall of the Museum of Passion in Valladolid, is hosting through 16 January 2011, 200 prints by Francisco de Goya, belonging to the complete series of 'Los Caprichos', 'The Disasters of War' and 'Bullfight', in an exhibition titled 'Goya, The genius of a writer'.

The show delves into the particular interpretation of Spain that the great Francisco de Goya (1746-1828)

that the great Francisco de Goya (1746-1828) made at the time, according to Art Daily. Throughout his career his expertise was evident in all genres ranging from portrait to landscape without missing the traditional themes that dictated his time and, of course, not forgetting the war and social issues. Besides numerous techniques mastered, not just drawing or oil but his ability as an engraver took him to keep company with the great masters of this technique. In 1799 Goya published a series of 80 prints titled 'Caprichos' depicting what he called "...the innumerable foibles and follies to be found in any civilized society, and from the common prejudices and deceitful practices which custom, ignorance, or self-interest have made usual."

The dark visions depicted in these prints are partly explained by his caption, "The sleep of reason produces monsters". Yet these are not solely bleak in nature and demonstrate the artist's sharp satirical wit, particularly evident in etchings

In the 1810s, Goya created a set of aquatint prints titled 'The Disasters of War' which depict scenes from the Peninsular War. The scenes are singularly disturbing, sometimes macabre in their depiction of battlefield horror, and represent an outraged conscience in the face of death and destruction. The prints were not published until 1863, 35 years after Goya's death.

#### 'Grit' Tops Friday Box Office

Paramount's 'True Grit' rang in the New Year at the top of the domestic Box office, grossing roughly \$8.2 million on Friday from 3,083 theaters to overtake Universal's 'Little Fockers'

The holiday take reps a fine start for 'True Grit' since Universal's 'Little Fockers' was expected to win the weekend. 'Fockers' could still wind up on top with Disney's 'Tron' gaining some steam, but positive reviews and strong word of mouth for the Par Western is good news for 'True Grit'.

Warner Bros.' 'Yogi Bear', with \$4.1 million, beat a crop of other 3D family-targeted films, including 20th Century Fox's 'The Chronicles of Namia: The Voyage of the Dawn Trader' and Disney's 'Tangled', which followed in standing with a respective \$3.5 million and \$3.3 million.

Fox's 3D Jack Black starrer 'Gulliver's Travels' fared with slightly less, taking in \$3 million on Friday.

New Year's totals, which typically benefit from increased movie going, should transfer through the weekend. Though without a similarly performing picture like 2009's 'Avatar', most box office experts predict 2010 totals to be down from 2009.

The weekend tally from Dec. 31 through Sunday are included in 2010's gross.



better-known works. He also edited 'Javaher-Al-Asmar' written by Emad ibn Mohammad Saghari in the 14th century. The book, which is a collection of stories told by a
parrot, was originally translated from Sanskrit to Pahlavi during the Sassanid era.
